From the findings of this study, secondary students in Mizoram had negative attitude towards mathematics subject. The Investigator would like to suggest that other method besides better method needs to be introduced for secondary students to have positive attitude in mathematics subject.

Significant difference was found in terms of gender and school management whereas no significant difference was found in terms of locality in secondary schools of Mizoram regarding the attitude of secondary schools. The Investigator suggests that for the equality of students' attitude in mathematics subject, teachers need to give their best effort in their respective posts. Not only this, special incentives besides the usual cash price given by SCERT through Science Promotion Wing needs to be given a boost so as to garner students' interest in the subject.

ECE WORKSHOP AT ICFAI UNIVERSITY, MIZORAM

On 13th February 2026, a highly informative and engaging workshop on Early Childhood Education (ECE) was conducted by Dr. Ruth Rosangpuii, Lecture (TE), SCERT. It was Organized by the department of education, ICFAI University, Mizoram, in Room 101. The session was attended by teaching staff and Master of education students and aimed at deepening understanding of early childhood development and effective teaching practices.

The workshop began with an introduction to ECCE, highlighting its importance in laying a strong foundation for children's overall growth and lifelong learning. Dr. Ruth Rosangpuii explained that ECCE focuses on the holistic development of children, covering multiple developmental domains such as physical, cognitive, language, and socio-emotional development.

One of the key highlights of the sessions was the discussion on developmental domains and their goals. She explained how these domains are interconnected and essential for a child's balanced development. She also introduced mental skills and pre-number concepts, which are important for early mathematical understanding. She used example from website Radiopaedia (normal hand x-rays-5-year-old) (<https://radiopaedia.org>) and explained the five goals.

- v Goal 1: Development of organs and physical growth.
- v Goal 2: social emotional development
- v Goal 3: Brain development, life skills and Math's ability.
- v Goal 4: literacy and language development
- v Goal 5: inspire children to appreciate the beauty and significance of art.

The workshop further explored the importance of play-based learning. Dr. Ruth emphasized that play is not just an activity but a powerful learning tool that helps children develop creativity, problem solving skills, and social interaction. Through play, children learn naturally and effectively.

Overall, the workshop was very useful and helped students understand early childhood education better. It also gave simple and practical ideas for teaching young children. The session was interactive, easy to understand, and inspiring for everyone.

In conclusion, Dr. Ruth's workshop was a meaningful learning experience that emphasized the significance of ECE in shaping the future of children and society.

The beauty of Tamdil Lake
